A Few Important Reminders - Reception and Deliveries

As we work to maintain a smooth and efficient school day, I would like to politely remind parents and carers to avoid bringing in forgotten items unless absolutely necessary. We have noticed an increase in the number of items being dropped off throughout the day, such as water bottles, homework and PE kits. While we understand that these things occasionally happen, the reception team is then required to contact teachers during lessons, which interrupts both the teacher's focus and the learning environment. On a lighter note, we are pleased to announce the addition of two new table tennis tables to our school grounds! It has been heart-warming to see students enthusiastically organising their own lunchtime competitions, fostering teamwork, friendly rivalry and a fun break from their studies. We have already introduced new basketball nets and small tennis nets along with other sports equipment to complement our extensive extra-curricular programme to enrich the lives of our students at lunchtime.

The Headteacher and other key Learning Support Department staff also attended and spoke to parents and carers about how we support our EHCP students. We will continue to offer these sessions to parents and carers of other groups of students as well to ensure strong communication and collaboration between home and school with parents and carers.



Outstanding Academic Achievements - GCSE and A-Level Success

It is with immense pride that I share with you some of the outstanding academic achievements from last year, which were presented at the Central England Academy Trust (CEAT) Trust Board meeting earlier this week.

Progress 8: Our students achieved the best-ever Progress 8 score in the school's history, with a score of +0.62. This means the average Year 11 student last year performed nearly two-thirds of a grade above their expected level in every subject. A remarkable feat!

GCSE English and Maths: 83% of last year's Year 11 cohort achieved a Grade 4 or higher in English and Maths. This is significantly higher than the Warwickshire average of 70%, placing Higham Lane as the highest-performing non-selective state schools in the county!

A-Level Performance: Our Year 13 students also excelled, achieving an impressive 58.5% of A*-B grades, 5.2% above the national average. This represents the best A-Level results the school has ever seen. These outstanding results reflect the dedication and hard work of our students and staff, and I could not be more proud of everyone involved.

We are particularly thrilled to see the Trust Board's glowing feedback on our academic performance. Higham Lane School's reputation for excellence continues to grow, and it's clear that our students are receiving the support they need to excel.

Mental Health Awareness - Supporting Our Students

On Thursday, we observed Mental Health Awareness Day with assemblies led by a mental health professional and our Lead Safeguarding Officer, Mrs Domigan. Mental health is a critical topic, and we are committed to ensuring that our students are equipped with the tools and knowledge they need to maintain their well-being. The assemblies focused on practical strategies for looking after mental health, recognising when to seek help, and ensuring that our students understand the support systems available to them at school. We encourage you to continue these important conversations at home, reinforcing the message that it's okay to ask for help.

A Successful Open Evening

Finally, I want to extend a heartfelt thank you to all the staff, students and parents who contributed to the success of our Open Evening on Thursday. As always, the event was a huge success, showcasing everything that makes Higham Lane School such a special place. Our reputation as a heavily oversubscribed school is a testament to the hard work of our community, and I am immensely grateful for everyone's efforts in making this event so memorable. A special mention goes to Richie and Sofia who are our Head Students who both presented speeches after the Headteacher speech, to around 300 parents and carers; this is a remarkable achievement for someone who is 15 or 16 years of age to have the confidence and oracy to do this. We are very proud of you both, well done Richie and Sofia! Whatever you decide to do in the future, I know you are going to be amazing!
