I am delighted to welcome everyone back after the half-term break and to share what a wonderful first week back we have had! Our students have returned with a fantastic attitude, showing excellent behaviour and a positive approach to their studies. Attendance has been particularly high, and this commitment is always appreciated, it is essential for achieving the best possible learning outcomes for our wonderful students here at Higham Lane School.

#### **Sixth Form Open Evening Success**

Our recent Sixth Form Open Evening was a tremendous success, and I want to extend my deepest thanks to all staff involved. Their hard work in preparing, guiding and showcasing our Sixth Form made the evening enjoyable and informative for all. Last year, we saw record numbers of applicants and enrolments for A-level studies, a trend we're excited to see continue. Impressively, almost 60% of grades in Year 13 last year were A\*, A, or B, with close to 30% of those being A\* or A - a result well above the national average. These achievements are a testament to our students' hard work, the support of their families and the dedication of our staff. We are excited to see our Sixth Form thrive further and encourage our Year 11s to consider taking this next step with us.

#### TIAAS Training: A Trauma-Informed Approach

I would like to express my appreciation to the staff who participated in our Trauma-Informed Attachment Awareness Schools (TIAAS) training on the final day of the last half which focused on emotion coaching, allowing our staff to gain deeper insights into brain function and how to effectively de-escalate situations where students may struggle with emotional regulation. Such knowledge empowers our teachers to build supportive, understanding relationships with students, enhancing their ability to succeed in a caring environment. We are committed to fostering an atmosphere where every student feels understood, valued, and empowered to thrive.

#### **Geography Trip to Norway**

A heartfelt thank you goes out to the Geography team, who selflessly led the trip to Norway over the break, giving up their own holiday time to provide our students with an unforgettable experience. Their dedication is genuinely appreciated, and I know how enriching this opportunity has been for those who attended. We have received lovely emails from parents sharing how much their children enjoyed and benefited from the trip, which speaks to the positive impact these experiences have on learning and personal growth. I also want to commend our students for representing Higham Lane School so well on the trip, the feedback on their behaviour has been exemplary.





#### **Transition Back to School Routine**

To help students ease back into the school routine, we held an extended tutor time for Years 7-11 on Monday 4th November during the first lesson of the day. This was an opportunity for students to re-establish routines, reconnect with their tutors and participate in a range of activities designed to support a smooth transition back to school. Both students and staff have provided positive feedback on this initiative, and we are proud of how well everyone has adjusted after the break.

#### **Celebrating Student Achievements**

Our students continue to impress us with their exceptional achievements, and I would like to share some recent highlights:

- Zak (Year 10) and Archie (Year 7) in an exciting new film set to be shot in Nuneaton in November! The project is led by former Higham Lane student Phil Coates, now a successful Hollywood producer, and Rebecca Jackson (née Gage), another alum who is the Casting Director. It's amazing to see our students involved in a project with such strong ties to the Higham Lane community, and we're immensely proud of Zak and Archie for earning these prestigious roles.
- Bobbin (Year 9) and Cookie (Year 8) represented England at the European Wadokai Championships in Cyprus, competing against teams from 11 countries in Kata and Kumite events. England finished first in the medal table, an incredible achievement that our students were part of. Although they didn't place individually, Cookie came close to winning a bronze medal, finishing 4th after two impressive fights. We are exceptionally proud of their dedication and sportsmanship and look forward to seeing them continue to achieve in future competitions.

Ameerah won the GU15 title, and Nadiya secured the GU13 title - outstanding achievements that highlight their talent and commitment. Higham Lane School has agreed to participate in an initiative involving a walkthrough metal detection arch (similar to those used at airports), which will be set up next week (week beginning 11th November). This activity is designed to be positive, educational and discreet, and we hope it will reinforce important messages about staying safe.

To accommodate this, all students must enter through Brookdale Gate in the mornings next week. Please remind your child to allow extra time if they typically use Higham Lane Gate, which will be closed. This initiative is part of our comprehensive approach to educating students on personal safety, with discussions on knife crime prevention scheduled during tutor times.

# Winter HAF 24/25 Holiday Activities & Food (HAF)

Dear Parent/Carer,

The Department for Education (DfE) funds the Holiday Activities & Food (HAF) programme across the United Kingdom. At it's core, HAF provides young people the opportunity to access enriching activities alongside healthy meals over the **main school holidays in Winter**, **Spring and Summer**.

Please note that this programme is entirely separate from the <u>Local Welfare Scheme</u>'s household support funding (i.e. supermarket HUGGG vouchers).

Each eligible young person (in full-time education from Reception to Year 11 who receives benefits-related free school meals) with a HAF code can access a maximum of **4 sessions** over the winter holidays. Families have the flexibility to book with multiple activity providers if desired. All providers can request additional funding for 1-to-1 support if this is required, however this will depend on their staff availability and qualifications. We do have a number of SEND-specific activities which may be a more suitable option.









Eligible families need to request a HAF Code via a brief online form. This can be found at <a href="www.warwickshire.gov.uk/haf">www.warwickshire.gov.uk/haf</a> or you can scan the QR code below. HAF codes are valid for the academic year, so if you've had a HAF code starting with a 'W' before, the same code can be used. If you need codes to be re-sent, just send us an email via <a href="mailto:hafprogramme@warwickshire.gov.uk">hafprogramme@warwickshire.gov.uk</a>

For families not in receipt of benefits-related free school meals, we can release a limited number of HAF codes for each delivery period. A separate referral form will need to be completed on behalf of your family, if you're facing a significant financial barrier and one (or more) of the following criteria apply:

- · Have an allocated family support worker or social worker
- On an open early help plan
- Your child(ren) acts as a young carer
